

OPEN AIR BURNING & FIRE REGULATIONS

NO FIRE SHALL BE SET OUT OF DOORS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF TUDOR AND CASHEL BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 7:00 AM AND 7:00 PM FROM APRIL 1ST TO OCTOBER 31ST.

1. A **“FIRE BAN”** means a total burning ban, no burning of debris, no burning in an incinerator and absolutely “no” camp fires. (tune in to 97.7 fm for updates during a ban)
2. When there is no “Fire Ban” in force
 - a) Do not burn any material restricted by the Ministry of the Environment such as rubber, plastic, treated wood, or any material which could cause toxic or noxious gases.
 - b) Any person starting an outdoor fire shall ensure that adequate personnel, equipment and water are available to contain and extinguish the fire and if said fire cannot be contained and extinguished the person(s) responsible shall notify the fire department immediately.
 - c) If the Fire Chief or his/her designate orders a fire extinguished the person(s) responsible shall extinguish the fire immediately. Failure to do so could result in fines being levied against the person or persons responsible.
3. No Person shall start a fire outdoors without ensuring that:
 - a) The conditions are safe and suitable for the fire.
 - b) There is an adult competent to control the fire in attendance from start to extinguishment.
 - c) There are no fire bans or fire restrictions in place at the time.
 - d) There are adequate personnel, equipment and water to control and extinguish the fire.
 - e) The fire is on bare mineral soil or rock and is at least 3 meters from any flammable material.
 - f) An incinerator must have a proper mesh cover and be no closer than five meters from any forest and two meters from any other flammable material.
 - g) Do not burn any material restricted by the Ministry of the Environment such as rubber, plastic, treated wood, or any material which could cause toxic or noxious gases.

IN THE EVENT THAT THE FIRE CANNOT BE CONTAINED NOTIFY THE FIRE DEPARTMENT IMMEDIATELY BY DIALING 9-1-1.

Note: For grass burning or burning of woody debris you will need to follow the ministry of natural resources regulations. Contact the Local Ministry Office at 613-332-3940
